What is a CT Scan?

A Computed Tomography (CT) scan – sometimes called CAT scan – is a non-invasive, painless medical test that helps providers diagnose and treat medical conditions.

CT imaging uses special X-ray equipment to produce multiple images or pictures of the inside of the body. A computer joins them together in cross-sectional views of the area being studied. The images can then be examined and interpreted from the computer.

CT scans of internal organs, bone, soft tissues and blood vessels provide greater clarity than conventional X-ray exams.

What is a CT Guided Ablation?

A CT guided ablation is a procedure where extreme cold, heat or radio waves are used to remove diseased tissue. A radiologist uses imaging from CT scan images as a guide to accurately place the needle.

During the procedure you will be lying on the scanner table. You will be given a local anesthetic that will numb the area around the site of the procedure. You will also have an IV placed for any medications that may be given to you. You will be asked to hold very still and hold your breath during certain times of the exam.

The ablation will take anywhere from 2 – 6 hours.

Preparation:

Do not eat anything after midnight the night before. Nothing to eat or drink EXCEPT clear liquids up to 3 hours before procedure.

For more preparation instructions regarding medications, speak to your provider.

Because your procedure will require signing a consent to complete the exam, Mercy requests you do not take any narcotics, sedatives or antianxiety medications four hours preceding your scheduled exam

Note: if you require anesthesia for your exam, you will receive a separate set of instructions from the anesthesia department.

Post Procedure:

You will be monitored and required to recover following the procedure.

You will be given additional post-procedure instructions following the exam.

Procedure Results:

A radiologist will review the images shortly after the exam is completed. A written report will be sent to the provider who ordered your exam. Your provider will discuss the results with you. Results will typically be available for your provider within two business days of the exam. Results will also be sent to your MyChart account.
