What is a PET/CT Scan?

Positron Emission Tomography with Computed Tomography (PET/CT) scanning is a non-invasive, painless medical test that helps detect cancer and greatly aids in treatment decisions. PET/CT produces pictures of metabolism (cell activity), which cannot be obtained with CT, Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) or conventional X-ray. While PET uses radioactive isotopes, its technology differs from that of Nuclear Medicine imaging. A PET/CT can find abnormalities such as tumors that might go undetected by other imaging methods now available locally. This information helps the provider determine which treatment would be most appropriate.

Preparation:

Drink approximately two (2) 8 oz. glasses of water, 1 hour prior to your scheduled exam time.

If you are on short-acting Somatostatins, you will be asked to not take the Somatostatin 24 hours prior to your scheduled exam time. If you are on long-acting Somatostatins, you will be asked to not take the Somatostatin 25 days prior to your scheduled exam time. Consult your provider before stopping any medication.

Procedure:

The Technologist will inject a small amount of radioactive material into your veins. You will be asked to remain in a recliner chair, refraining from repetitive movement or conversation for 45-60 minutes. You will be placed on your back on the scanner where images will be taken for 15-25 minutes.

Procedure Results:

A radiologist will review the images shortly after the exam is completed. A written report will be sent to the provider who ordered your exam. Your provider will discuss the results with you. Results will typically be available for your provider within two business days of the exam. Results will also be sent to your MyChart account.
